Date	Event	Description
1948	National Party Government comes to power.	The party implements stronger racial segregation laws, creating the system of apartheid.
1950	Group Areas Act	Over 3 million people are forcibly relocated.
1950	Population Registration Act	All South Africans are identified according to racial categories: Bantu (black African), white, or Coloured (of mixed race).
March 21, 1960	Sharpeville Massacre	Police open fire on demonstrators, killing 69 and wounding as many as 300.
April 27, 1994	Constitution re-written and free elections	Apartheid ends.
